

#### **Speech**

1. XX will articulate the initial /v/ when presented with monosyllabic and disyllabic words in a set of three flashcards with the printed words with a 66% degree of accuracy rating.

Tactile: Place the client's hand on the clinician's throat to feel the vibration for voicing.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will go through a set of three index cards with vocab words for both the initial /v/ and the initial /y/.
- The clinician will ask the client to read the printed words on the flashcards.
- If needed, the clinician will present the client with an image for the more challenging words (e.g. a picture of a flower vase for the word "vase" or a picture of a child wearing a visor at the beach for "visor").
- The clinician will place the known words for each phoneme on the right side of the table.

  The unknown words for each phoneme will be placed on the left side of the table.
- The clinician will record the results.

## **Speech Reading**

XX will auditorily and visually discriminate between 5 sets of two sentences by answering two comprehensive questions per set with a 60% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication, as needed.
- The clinician will sit directly across from the client and read off two sentences followed by two comprehension questions.
- The clinician will repeat these steps for all five different sets of sentences and questions repeating the prompts when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.

## **Auditory Listening**

XX will auditorily discriminate between 5 sets of two sentences by answering two comprehensive questions per set with a 50% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will stand behind the client's better ear, the left, and orally read two sentences followed by two comprehension questions.
- The clinician will repeat these steps for all five different sets of sentences and questions repeating the prompts as needed.
- The clinician will record the results.

## Language

1. XX will categorize verb tenses, present, future, and past, with a 50% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will begin by giving a review lesson on verb tenses. She will explain what present, future, and past tenses are as well as give examples of each.
  - o Present: what is happening "right now"
    - EX: we sit, we talk...
  - o Future: something that will happen "later"
    - EX: we will sit, we will talk...
  - o Past: something that "already" happened
    - EX: we sat, we talked...
- The clinician will then provide the client with a worksheet with present, future, and past written across the top.
- The client will place all six notecards under the appropriate category.
- The clinician will then explain if any mistakes were made, and together they will put the note cards in the correct column.
- The clinician will record the results.
- 2. XX will articulate 5 words from the Dolch Word List at a second-grade level with an 80% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will go through a set of five index cards with sight words from the Dolch Word List at the second-grade level.
- The clinician will ask the client to read the printed words on the flashcards.
- Together the clinician and the client will demonstrate definitions of each word, and if needed, the clinician will present a visual representation of the word.
- The clinician will place the known words on the right side of the table. The unknown words will be placed on the left side of the table.
- The clinician will record the results.

## **Reading Comprehension**

1. XX will match five vocabulary words to their pictures and definitions when presented with a worksheet inclusive of a word bank with a 40% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will give the client time to complete the worksheet and help when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.
- 2. XX will place five vocabulary words in context when presented with a worksheet containing a word bank and fill-in-the-blank sentences with a 60% degree of accuracy rating.

#### Methodology:

- The clinician will provide the client with a worksheet to complete involving five vocab words in a word box and five sentences each with a missing word.
- The clinician will give the client time to place the correct vocab word in each sentence and help when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.

3. XX will write the answer to five comprehensive questions when presented with a short poem, *In Summer*, at the second-grade level from SuperTeachers.com with an 80% degree of accuracy rating.

## Methodology:

- The clinician will provide the client with a worksheet including one short story from Superteachers.com at the second-grade level and five comprehensive questions.
- The clinician will give the client time to read the story aloud and answer the questions.
- The clinician will point out any wrong answers, and together they will make the necessary corrections.
- The clinician will record the results.

#### **Writing**

XX will write three subject verb agreement sentences when presented with five different pictures with a 33% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will begin by giving a short lesson on the 3<sup>rd</sup> singular -s.

- The clinician will then present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will present the client with a worksheet. The worksheet will have three pictures as well as a chart labeled article, noun, and verb for each individual picture.
- Together, the clinician and client will act out the picture before the client writes each individual sentence.

- The client will complete the worksheet by writing three subject-verb agreement sentences.
- The clinician will record the results.
