

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will go through a set of three index cards with vocab words for both the initial /v/ and the initial /y/.
- The clinician will ask the client to read the printed words on the flashcards.
- If needed, the clinician will present the client with an image for the more challenging words (e.g. a picture of a ballot for the word "vote" or a picture of a child yawning for "yawn").
- The clinician will place the known words for each phoneme on the right side of the table.

 The unknown words for each phoneme will be placed on the left side of the table.
- The clinician will record the results.

Speech Reading

XX will auditorily and visually discriminate between 5 sets of two sentences by answering two comprehensive questions per set with a 60% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will sit directly across from the client and read off two sentences followed by two comprehension questions.
- The clinician will repeat these steps for all five different sets of sentences and questions repeating the prompts when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.

• The clinician will begin by reviewing directional vocabulary words: near, far, under, above, right, and left.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.
- The clinician will stand behind the client's better ear, the left, and orally read six directions.
- The client will point to the provided map of Disney after each direction, and the clinician will repeat the directions as needed.
- The clinician will record the results.

Methodology:

• The clinician will begin by giving a short review lesson on parts of speech. She will explain what an article, noun, and verb are as well as give examples of each.

- o Article: a word that comes before a noun
 - EX: A, An, or The
- o Noun: person, place, or thing
 - EX: girl, boy, dog, cat...
- Verb: word that shows action
 - EX: eat, sleep, run, jump, climb...
- The clinician will provide the client with a paper with article, noun, and verb labeled across the top.
- The clinician will also provide the client with six note cards containing two articles, two nouns, and two verbs.
- The client will place each note card under the correct part of speech.
- The clinician will explain if any mistakes were made, and together they will put the note cards in the correct column.
- The clinician will record the results.
- 2. XX will articulate 5 words from the Dolch Word List at a second-grade level with an 80% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will present instructions in Total Communication as needed.

- Together the clinician and the client will demonstrate definitions of each word, and if needed, the clinician will present a visual representation of the word.
- The clinician will place the known words on the right side of the table. The unknown words will be placed on the left side of the table.
- The clinician will record the results.

- The clinician will give the client time to complete the worksheet and help when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.
- 2. XX will place five vocabulary words in context when presented with a worksheet containing a word bank and fill-in-the-blank sentences with a 60% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will give the client time to place the correct vocab word in each sentence and help when needed.
- The clinician will record the results.
- 3. XX will write the answer to four comprehensive questions and one inference question when presented with a short poem, *Seashell Fun*, at the second-grade level from SuperTeachers.com with an 80% degree of accuracy rating.

- The clinician will record the results.


